No Matter What: Unify

Philippians 2:1-4



Day #1 – Read Philippians 2:1 | *Is there any encouragement from belonging to Christ? Any comfort from his love? Any fellowship together in the Spirit? Are your hearts tender and compassionate?*

What encouragement, comfort, fellowship, and compassion have you experienced because of your connection to Christ and the church? Express your gratitude to God today.

Day #2 – Read Philippians 2:2 | *Then make me truly happy by agreeing wholeheartedly with each other, loving one another, and working together with one mind and purpose.*

What three things is Paul asking the Philippians to do in this verse? What would your church be like if everyone lived into these words? How can you live into them today?

Day #3 – Read Philippians 2:3 | *Don't be selfish; don't try to impress others. Be humble, thinking of others as better than yourselves.*

It's been said that humility isn't thinking less of yourself but thinking of yourself less often. How would you define humility? How can you live more humbly today?

Day #4 – Read Philippians 2:4 | *Don't look out only for your own interests, but take an interest in others, too.*

Pay attention to the conversations you have today. How often do you turn the subject of the conversation back to yourself? Practice staying focused on the "interests" of the other person today.

Day #5 –Read Philippians 2:1-4 | Is there any encouragement from belonging to Christ? Any comfort from his love? Any fellowship together in the Spirit? Are your hearts tender and compassionate? Then make me truly happy by agreeing wholeheartedly with each other, loving one another, and working together with one mind and purpose. Don't be selfish; don't try to impress others. Be humble, thinking of others as better than yourselves. Don't look out only for your own interests, but take an interest in others, too.

Throughout this week you've been challenged to live into each of these verses. How'd it go? What was easy? What was challenging? Ask God for what you need to live more deeply into these challenging words in the days ahead.
