LIFE APP

Compassion | Caring enough to do something about someone else’s need

BASIC TRUTH

I should treat others the way I want to be treated...and with God’s help I can!

FOR LEADERS ONLY

GOD VIEW: the connection between **COMPASSION** and God’s character, as shown through God’s big story.

THIS WEEK—Key Question: How will you love others? Showing God’s love to others is an important part of following Jesus. We want to help families figure out a plan for how they can show compassion to others and help them realize how much God loves them.

We finish our series on compassion in **1 John 4:9-12**, where we read about God’s great love for us when God sent Jesus to pay the price for our sins. John reminds us that no one has ever seen God, but when we show love to others, people see God through us.

Bottom Line: Love others because God loved you first. This week, we want to help families connect their compassion to the source of compassion. We show love to others, not just because it’s a good thing to do, but also because it’s what God did for us and what God calls us to do for others.

SOCIAL: PROVIDING TIME FOR FUN INTERACTION

Welcome kids and spend time engaging in conversation and catching up. Get ready to experience today’s story.

Before kids arrive, **PRAY** for each group member by name. Thank God that we can show compassion and spread God’s love during every season, not just the Christmas season. Pray that kids would be encouraged today to continue their journey of compassion and loving others because God loved us first.

•• **EARLY ARRIVER IDEA**

Made to Move | An activity that increases the oxygen in the brain and taps into the energy in the body

What You Need: Ball-pit ball

What You Do:

- Lead kids to sit around your small group table.
- Give a child the ball and invite her to tell her favorite thing that happened during December (so far). She then says another child’s name and rolls the ball to them.
- Continue until each child has a turn.
- **[Make It Personal]** If a child rolls the ball to you, tell your favorite thing.

•• **WHICH COMES FIRST?**

Made to Play | An activity that encourages learning through following guidelines and working as a group

What You Need: No supplies needed

What You Do:

- Ask a series of “Which Comes First?” questions, guiding kids to pretend to be the



thing that comes first!

- Which comes first:
 - An egg or a chick?
 - A caterpillar or a butterfly?
 - A snowman or snow?
 - A campfire or a warm, melty, gooey s'more?
 - A plant or a seed?
 - A tadpole or a frog?
 - A cloud or rain?
- Encourage active participation by saying things like: "Wow, it's so c-c-c-cold in here! Look at all the snow!" "Aw, what sweet little eggs. I wonder when they'll hatch?" "So many caterpillars! They must be hungry. What will I feed them?" "What soft, fluffy, puffy clouds. I wonder if I'll need an umbrella."

What You Say: "You all made great eggs and caterpillars and snowflakes and campfires and seeds and tadpoles and clouds! [Transition] **"Today in Sunday CM worship/WOW family worship, we'll learn/we learned about something else that comes first."**

[Sunday Leaders: Lead your group to the Family Room for Children's Ministry worship. Wednesday Leaders: Continue with the study.]

GROUPS: CREATING A SAFE PLACE TO CONNECT

Create a safe place to connect and learn how the Bible story applies to real life experiences, through interactive activities and discussion questions.

•• **EVERY SEASON** [Live for God | Application Activity]

Made to Imagine | An activity that promotes empathy and facilitates biblical application through role-play and reenactment

What You Need: "Seasons" activity cards, "Every Season" activity cards

What You Do:

- Lead kids in a variation of "Four Corners."
- Divide your small group table into four sections. Set a "Seasons" card face up and its two corresponding "Every Season" cards face down in each section.
- Order the seasons clockwise.
- Close your eyes and tell kids to pick a season and stand by its card.
- Slowly and methodically count down from ten. When you say "one," every child must be standing by their chosen season card.
- With your eyes still closed, call out the name of a season. Open your eyes.
- Guide one of the kids standing by that season's card to pick an "Every Season" card and show it to her group.
- Each child in that group then pantomimes that act of compassion while the other kids guess what it is.
- Continue either as time remains or until kids pantomime all the cards.

What You Say: "This month, we've been learning all about compassion—caring enough to do something about someone else's need. We don't show compassion just because it's Christmas. We love others—always and every day—because God loves US always and every day.

"So what are some ways you can show God's love to others all year long? (Kids can come up with their own ideas, or they can personalize the "Every Season" cards: I can wash my neighbor's windows. I can bake cookies for the new family down the street. I can rake leaves for my granddad. I can play with my little brother when he's lonely.) [Make It Personal] **(Tell kids a way you can show compassion as well.)**

●● **MOVE** [Hear from God | Memory Verse Activity]

Made to Move | An activity that increases the oxygen in the brain and taps into the energy in the body

What You Need: Bible

What You Do:

- Guide kids to look up and read the verse using the navigation tips below...

Finding verses with Kindergartners + 1st graders: Open a Bible to the front and find the table of contents. (*Show the kids what the page looks like.*) Lead them to find John in the list under “New Testament.” You can help by telling them that John starts with the letters J-O. When the kids find John, lead them to look at the page number beside the word. Explain that the number tells them on what page they can find John. Help the kids find the page. When they find John, explain that the big numbers on the page are the chapter numbers. Help them find chapter 3. Explain that the small numbers are verse numbers. Help them find verse 16 in chapter 3. Read the verse aloud to your group. Then lead everyone to say the verse together.

- Together, come up with motions for the verse or use the suggested motions below. Begin slowly, and then add challenge by going faster and faster as kids learn the motions.

—God | *pointing to the sky*

—so loved | *cross your arms over your chest*

—the world | *both hands move outward, palms facing up*

—that he gave | *both hands move forward like you are giving a gift*

—his One and only Son | *use pointer finger to show one and then fold arms like holding a baby*

—Anyone | *point to everyone*

—who believes | *give a thumbs up*

—in him | *point to sky or use one finger to touch the middle of the palm of each of your hands (sign language for “Jesus”)*

—Will not die but have eternal life. | *move hands back and forth, palms down, to say “no” then flip hands palms up and raise to the sky*

What You Say: “When God sent Jesus, God showed us that God loves us more than we can ever imagine. God sent Jesus to live on earth, to die on a cross, and to come back to life so that if we put our trust in Jesus, we can live forever with God. Wow! Now that’s an amazing love!

“But what about the people who don’t know that God loves them? Sometimes just telling them isn’t enough. We need to show them God’s love by loving them ourselves. So what are some ways you can show God’s love to others? (*I can let my friends choose what to play first. I can say kind things to my brother instead of yelling at him. I can get a BAND-AID® for someone who’s hurt.*) Great ideas! When you put others first, when you say kind things, and when you help someone who’s hurting, you’re showing God’s love to others. So remember: **[Bottom Line] love others because God loved you first.**”

●● **WE LOVE** [Talk about God | Bible Story Review]

Made to Create | An activity that explores spiritual ideas through the process of drawing, building, and designing

What You Need: Bible, “3D Heart Patterns” activity page, crayons, scissors

What You Do:

- Give each child a “3D Heart Patterns” activity page.
- Encourage kids to color the hearts as they choose.
- As kids work, read today’s bible story from 1 John 4:9-12.
- Talk about the Bible story and the truth that God loved us so much that God gave us Jesus.
