If we know we can trust God no matter what, we know that God’s timing is always right. Even when it feels like we are waiting forever! Pray and ask God to help you in the waiting.

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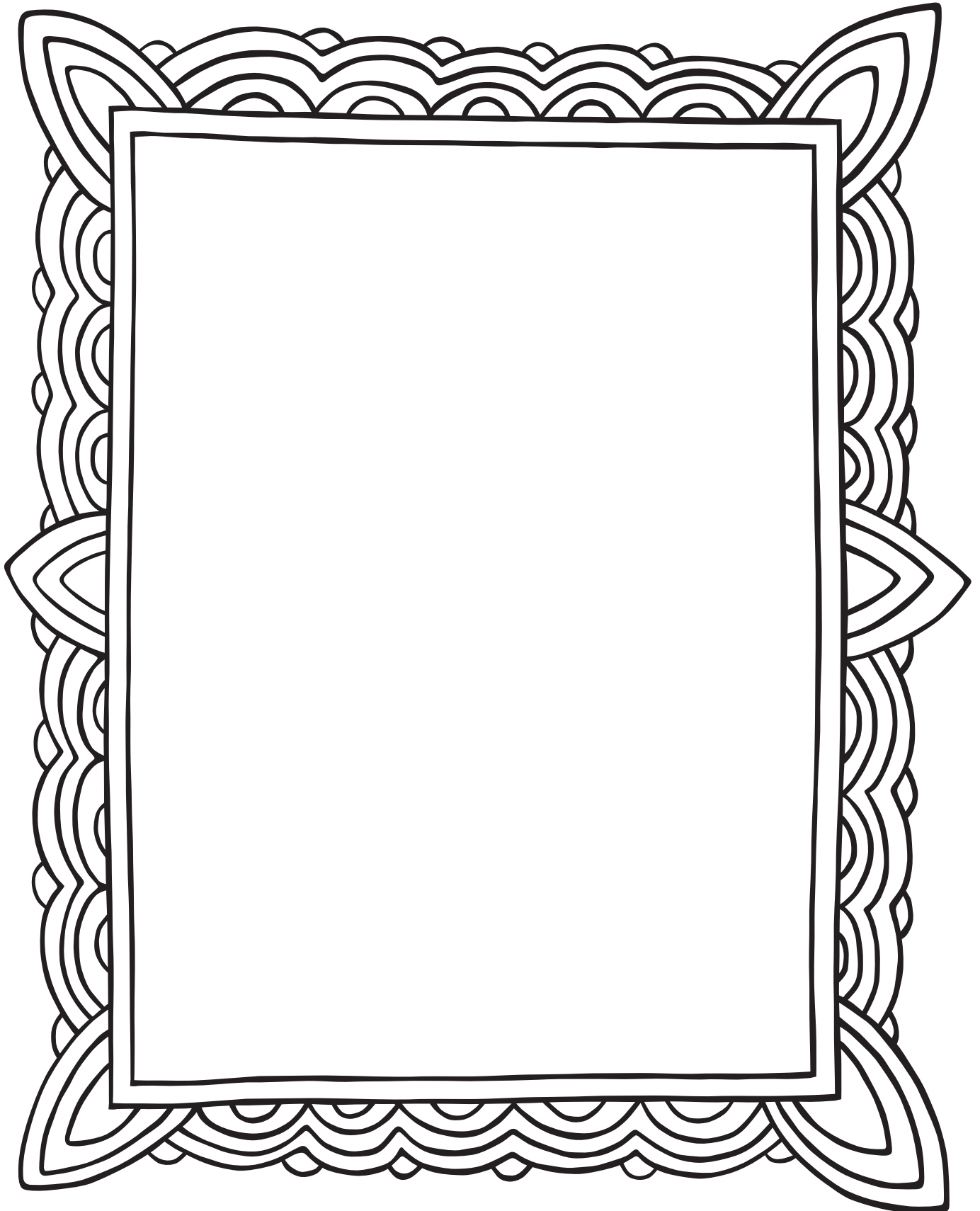
Dear God, waiting is so hard. Please give me patience when I have to wait. I know that you always do what is best for me. Help me to always trust your ways over mine. Amen.
