DO SOMETHING | MARCH 17-23, 2021
BOTTOM LINE: God is doing something about injustice.

"For you have been called to live in freedom, my brothers and sisters. But don't use your freedom to satisfy your sinful nature. Instead, use your freedom to serve one another in love."

- Galatians 5:13 NLT

>> MARCH 17

Jesus sets people free. And that's great news for us! But what does that actually mean? Well, it means that we have a choice: We can use our freedom to do what we want with our lives, or we can use our freedom to follow God's plan with our lives. When we use our freedom to live for ourselves, we miss out on the chance to impact others with God's love. So this week, as you find yourself deciding what to do with your freedom, stop and remember this verse. Ask God to remind you that your freedom is a gift to be used to serve and love others. It's a gift to be used to live your life for God.

>> MARCH 18

No one likes to be treated unfairly. When it happens, it usually makes us feel angry, or lonely, or frustrated. Maybe you even wonder if anyone—including God—cares about the injustice you've experienced. In moments like that, it's important to remember that God is a God who is for justice. God loves justice. And because of that, God's heart is broken by injustice or unfair treatment of any kind. God cares about the hurts and wrongs we experience. So today, take time to tell God about any injustice you've experienced. Trust that God cares about you and is with you in the middle of whatever you're going through.

"He will not falter or lose heart until justice prevails throughout the earth. Even distant lands beyond the sea will wait for his instruction."

- Isaiah 42:4 NLT

>> MARCH 19

It can be easy to be discouraged over the injustice around you. You might feel discouraged, sad, or even defeated by the things you see happening in the world. When you feel that way—when you're struggling not to lose heart—remember this verse. It's a great reminder that God won't stop working or give up until the wrongs of the world are made right. To help you remember that, memorize this verse. Let it remind you that God is always working for the good of God's people.

"And this same God who takes care of me will supply all your needs from his glorious riches, which have been given to us in Christ Jesus."

- Philippians 4:19 NLT

>> MARCH 20

There's a difference between your needs and your wants. While there's nothing wrong with wanting more than you actually need, it's important to remember that God promises to provide not everything we want, but everything we need. In fact, God has already met our greatest need—the need for a relationship with God. Our sins are forgiven because of Jesus' death on the cross, so we get to have a relationship with the God who loves us more than anybody. When you feel worried that you won't have something you need, remember that God has already provided what you need most through Jesus. Try to look for one way you see God meeting your needs this week and write it down. When you need a reminder that God provides for you, look back at what you wrote!

Have you ever lit a candle in a dark room? It's amazing how one small flame can light up a dark room. God's love does the same thing. When our world feels sad, or hopeless, or gloomy, God's love brings light to show us something better. How does God do it? Through us! God uses us to bring light to the people and places in the world that are hurting. God uses us to make things right. God uses us to make a change. Today, pray and ask God to show you how to bring light to someone in your life. Maybe it's through a kind word, an encouraging note, or a simple invitation to hang out. Whatever it is, be the light by loving someone else this week!

Have you ever known somebody who never made a mistake? Never messed up? Never did anything wrong? Of course not! Because we're all human! We're all going to make mistakes.
