To this day, I can clean a walleye in under 3 minutes. With a fillet knife.</p> <p>Time went by as it is want to do and I got older, went into middle school and somehow something in me changed. I never had the right jeans, the right shoes, the right socks, the right portable CD player (the ipod wasn’t invented yet)... I most certainly didn’t have the right boat.</p> <p>There was one day in particular that we were putting the boat in. this was after we spray painted it matte green so it could double as a duck boat, where I assume the son of a guy putting in the latest Lund Pro-V shouted from his boat, “you know they have biffys where you can drop a dump so you don’t have to do it in the lake!”</p>

But, Jesus, our Lord and good shepherd wants us to live and live to the fullest. The word that I want to give the feeling of that living tonight is “contentment.”</p>

Before we think that wanting things we don't have is something new, I want to take you to a place where Jesus is addressing this feeling in his disciples. Turn with me to Matthew 6:25-34. Let's read that together.

It is important to note who Jesus is reading this to. These are poor folks from the country. They are folks that have to scrape together a living. They are folks who have been fed the lie that having a lot of stuff is to have blessings from God. In other words, they feel like you do sometimes when they realize they don't have what others have. The result is that their joy is robbed.

What does Jesus say to them? Two quick things:

1. Life is bigger than stuff – I think we get that, but we so easily forget it when over the course of the day we receive in excess 4,000 advertising messages to the contrary. But, you know it is true: you've learned it in the embrace of your parents. You've learned it in the care of your grandparents. You've learned it in the joy of giving. You've learned it in the furry snuggles of your dog or cat. Life simply cannot be contained in stuff, so it is OK if we let ourselves off the hook for not having it sometimes.

2. You only need a little to have a lot of purpose – This is a group of people that Jesus is asking to follow him. To follow him into living a certain kind of way. A way that isn't about chasing after money, about chasing after power, about chasing after status. If you read everything that comes before this section right here, the point will become clear: Jesus is asking these people to give their lives to loving others the way that he does. He's asking them to forgo the rat race of consumption to step into the human race that so desperately needs love. The beauty of it all is: they don't need much more than lilies, birds, and the many other things God sustains in the world already to do it. They are equipped.

So what do we do with this news? How do we lean into it? How do we achieve that life and contentment that Jesus wants his followers to have? I have just a few suggestions:

1. Hear a new story: You are bombarded with messages that cause you to feel inadequate and want what you don't have. So good are the messengers that they have fooled you into carrying around the bullhorn in your pocket and looking at it 86 times a day. Seek out people who are living with what they have and learn from their story.

2. Take an honest inventory: Make a list of what you do have: the money, the possessions, the experiences, the relationships, the things, and everything else that you have. Pretend that you are packing to move and you have to put everything into a box. Make separate boxes: money, stuff, relationships, purpose. Then fill them.

3. Assess your purpose: The logic that makes all of this make sense is fairly specific. Finding joy in what you have and not letting that joy be robbed by what you don't is a fairly anti-capitalistic way of thinking. Not that Jesus is opposed to capitalism, but at a certain point the two ways of thinking split off. Where they split off is on the point of purpose. When you become a follow of Jesus you become a part of the movement, the change in the world that leads people and things from death to life. This forward motions, this getting in line with Jesus is a filter. It includes some things and excludes others. What are you here for?

Here's why: Our attitudes about things like money when we are kids end up impacting our attitudes about money when we are adults.</p> <p>We had pulled the little red boat 1,000 miles across the country to Strawberry Reservoir in Utah to go trout fishing. My dad's twin was living there at the time. Well, his twin was doing remarkably better in business than he was and one evening while we sitting in the middle of a bay jigging power bait off the bottom my dad looked over to me and said, "I'm sorry that I can't give you some of the things you want. I know that bothers you." He collected himself and went on, "I'm sure glad that we got to go on this trip, though. It might not be much, but sure as hell isn't any one else catching fish but us."</p> <p>Trying to avoid an ugly man cry moment.</p> <p>I just said, "I'm glad that we're here too."</p> <p>I'm 32 and a dad now. I have two boys and if I am honest, there are days when I wish that I could give them the things their friends have. But then I remember that moment on the boat and I remember that what I have to give my sons is so much more than money can buy. While I have the influence I have over them I want them to know that, so that when they have kids of their own they can be like the flowers f the field and the birds of the air resting in the love and purpose of God.</p>
