### >> JANUARY 31

As we grow in our faith we become more like Jesus. The more we live like Jesus, the more we're keeping the Greatest Commandment! Jesus knew Scripture and quoted it often. So, when we do the same, we're following Jesus' example! We're memorizing what's important to Him as a way to help us know Him more.

To work on memorizing this verse, talk to your family or a close friend about it. Ask them what they think it means and how they live that way in their own lives. Then, as you read it and try to memorize it yourself, think about what they shared with you!

### >> FEBRUARY 1

The older we get, the more freedom we want to have—freedom from rules, freedom from chores, freedom from our parents. While we want freedom to do the things we want, the Bible reminds us that the point of our freedom is actually to use it to do what God calls us to do. And often, God calls us to use that freedom to love and serve others. It isn't easy, but as you grow, focus on using your freedom the way God wants you to use it. Focus on loving others!

### >> FEBRUARY 2

We all have problems! And when we're dealing with problems in our lives, it can be easy to forget that others around us may be going through similar things. In what ways do you show other people you value them? According to Paul's letter to the people in the city of Philippi, we're supposed to value others above ourselves. We should prioritize other people above ourselves. This is a hard truth to accept— and even harder to practice—but it's one that will help us stay truly humble.

Did you know that God doesn't play favorites? Now, this might seem like good news or bad news depending on how your week is going. But really, the truth is that this is GOOD news for EVERYONE.
