Bible Time Fact

The story of Moses and the burning bush took place on Mt. Horeb, which is also called Mt. Sinai. It became known as the Mountain of God and is the place where God gave Moses the Ten Commandments.

Bottom Line

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See It

When you see the flame of a candle or flames in a fireplace, remember God speaking to Moses.



Hear It

The Spark Story Bible describes God voice as “thundering.” Try saying “Take off your shoes!” in a thundering voice.



Talk About It

1. In this week’s Bible story, how did God get Moses’ attention? How do your teachers, friends, parents, etc. get your attention? What important things do they tell you when they have your attention?
2. What did God need Moses to do? What do you think God needs YOU to do?
3. What is the most amazing thing you have ever seen?
4. What are the big and little challenges you have coming up this week? Remind each other that God promises to be with you.



Live It

For families to do together: Build a fire or light a candle and talk about what you think God’s voice sounds like. What are some ways you hear God talking to you?

For preschool kids: Find a wide open space (preferably outside) and take off one shoe. Then step into the shoe with your toes, but leave your heel out. Try kicking your leg and seeing how far you can fling your shoe. As you do this activity, think about God telling Moses to take off his shoes because he was standing on holy ground.
