Rummaging through old boxes of family memorabilia, we inevitably run across works of art from days gone by. The handprint turned into a turkey, the red Valentine’s Day hearts accompanying a handwritten poem, each treasure speaking volumes of love and making us wonder, “Where did that creative impulse come from?”

We might also ask, “Where did it go?”

There comes a time when we must reclaim our creative impulse. In the ancient book of Psalms, buried deeply in the Hebrew scriptures, the writer uses the moment of creation to connect us with the Source of all things. Eugene Peterson translated part of Psalm 139 in the Message Bible this way:

“Oh yes, you shaped me first inside, then out; you formed me in my mother’s womb. I thank you, God — you’re breathtaking! Body and soul, I am marvelously made! I worship in adoration — what a creation! You know me inside and out; you know every bone in my body; you know exactly how I was made, bit by bit, how I was sculpted from nothing into something.”

Here we find a Creator gathering elemental particles and holding them all together. Holding *us* all together; cradling, shaping, molding, and breathing the oxygen of creative life into us. As the Creator breathes life and aliveness into dust and dirt, we, all of us dirt creatures, become animated, enthused, and inspired by the breath and creativity of God. We are filled with a generative impulse that begins in the first moments of creation and continues with each breath we receive. Through that ongoing, generative impulse, we participate in the ongoing re-creation of the world.

- *What sparks your creativity? Have you ever considered the parallel between the divine act of creation and your creative endeavors? Does making that connection change how you feel about your own creativity?*
- *Researcher Bréné Brown says that unexpressed creativity eventually comes out as rage or depression. Why do you think that is? Why is suppressing your creative impulse so damaging? What does that say about your connection to God?*
- *What is one small and enjoyable way you can express your creativity today? Whether it’s a doodle, a short poem, or a simple rearrangement in your living space, how does it feel to participate in creation?*
