#### >> READ PHILIPPIANS 3:1-11

- Who are the “dogs,” “evildoers” and “those who mutilate the flesh?” How are they contrasted with the Philippians?
- Paul called us to “rejoice in the Lord.” His very next thought is to “Look out for the dogs, look out for the evildoers, look out for those who mutilate the flesh.” How might the influence of these people keep the Philippians from rejoicing in the Lord?
- What does it mean to “put no confidence in the flesh?” Why do you think Paul gives himself as an example of this? What does Paul put his confidence in now?
- Look over Paul’s credentials. What “gain” was he deriving from them? Why does he now see them as loss?
- What does it mean to be “found in” Christ? How is this related to being righteous?
- Paul says the ultimate purpose of being righteous is so that he can know Christ and the power of his resurrection. What does he mean by these things?
- What is the resurrection of the dead?
