GATHER Ephesians 1:1-10

EPHESIANS 1:1-10 Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, to the saints who are in Ephesus and are faithful in Christ Jesus: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, just as he chose us in Christ before the foundation of the world to be holy and blameless before him in love. He destined us for adoption as his children through Jesus Christ, according to the good pleasure of his will, to the praise of his glorious grace that he freely bestowed on us in the Beloved. In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace that he lavished on us. With all wisdom and insight he has made known to us the mystery of his will, according to his good pleasure that he set forth in Christ, as a plan for the fullness of time, to gather up all things in him, things in heaven and things on earth.

FROM PAUL DEAN'S SERMON There are people who take great pleasure in restoring things, reclaiming things. Furniture, cars, houses, things made from brass, things made out of steel or wood. We have tv shows, auctions and events celebrating that kind of restoration. They celebrate those who choose to see beyond the effects of neglect, accidents or basic wear and tear. They can see a way back; a redemption of sorts.

The same is true for lived experiences. We all have stories about the effects of neglect, accidents, mistakes or just basic wear and tear in our lives. And in each of those stories we pray and hope for a way back, for redemption.

FOR REFLECTION What does it mean to restore something? Do you think that people can be restored? What does that mean? What does it look or feel like to be a restored person? Do you have any experience with this kind of restoration?

What do you think it means for God to gather all things? What images come to mind when you hear that phrase? Does God really mean ALL things? Everything? Is this a hopeful image? Does it seem possible? What kind of God would gather up every single thing?

FOR REFLECTION If God is in the business of retelling, reframing stories, what does that mean for your life? Can God gather it all up and make even the bad parts compelling? How do the ups and downs, twists and turns in our lives somehow point to a larger force, a God that holds it all together? Is that the same kind of story we read in scripture – full of joys and sorrows, enormous mistakes and blunders, and ultimately a God who never leaves us alone? Why is that important?
