Trust the Story | Lost in Translation | That's Enough

The Bible is complex and multi-layered, but it invites all of us to lean in and look closer as it reveals, story by story, who God is ... and also who we are.

From the beginning, we imagine a God that keeps speaking to us through these stories of redemption and hope. But along the way we've lost the fullness of the message. So much of the story can get lost in translation. Lost in the literal translation from Hebrew and Greek to English. Lost in different cultural contexts. Lost in repetition, lulling us into a familiarity that strips the story of its power.

It's like looking in a window. You can't always see the whole room from your vantage point. Sometimes you need a second window, or a third, in order to see into every corner. Sometimes you can never see the whole thing. It's an exploration, a discovery, that invites you to look again and again from new angles.

We are called to trust the story, turning each page with the desire to find what's been lost in translation.

When do we say "enough"?

In Genesis 2:3, God stops creating and rests. Why do you think that's important? As image-bearers of God, are we also created to create sometimes and rest sometimes? What does that look like?

Are we a culture that's good at saying "enough"? When is enough actually enough? What does enough feel like?

Do we know when to say enough while we're gossiping? When we're tempted to criticize one another? When we fret and worry about the political climate in our nation? When we expect perfection from others but forgiveness for ourselves?

Do we know when to say enough as we engage in our own negative self-talk? When that newest shiny thing catches our attention? When we watch our earth get warmer and warmer and warmer? Do we know when to say enough as wars and battles rage around the world?

How do we live into a concept of enough in a world that demands more, bigger, better, faster?

What gets lost or sacrificed when we spend our lives chasing after more?
