
Spring Into Serving

This weekend we are celebrating and witnessing our students get confirmed at the 10:30 am service. Being confirmed calls us to remember our baptisms. At our baptisms, our parents, sponsors, family, and congregation gathered to make promises as we entered into this new life in the body of Christ. They promised to guide and support us in a life of faith, pointing us to God's love along the way.

I always tell the youth going through confirmation that those promises don't stop at confirmation. Being confirmed is a way for you to say, "I want to enter into the those promises, as well." They are confirming everything that happened in their baptisms, and saying it is important to them both now and moving forward.

How do we, as a congregation making these promises, take the promises seriously? What ways do you think this congregation keeps its promises to the children of this congregation? What are ways that we could do a better at walking alongside their faith journey?

I remember going through confirmation. I was at a different church than where my school friends went. I had to make church friends. My parents made me go every Wednesday and it was boring. We watched the Ten Commandments, we had to do memorization, and we had to attend a lock-in.

If you have been confirmed, what do you remember about it?

Or if you were baptized when you weren't a baby, what do you remember about that experience?

How do you think you live into the promises of your baptism/confirmation? Where are areas of faith you want to dive in deeper?
