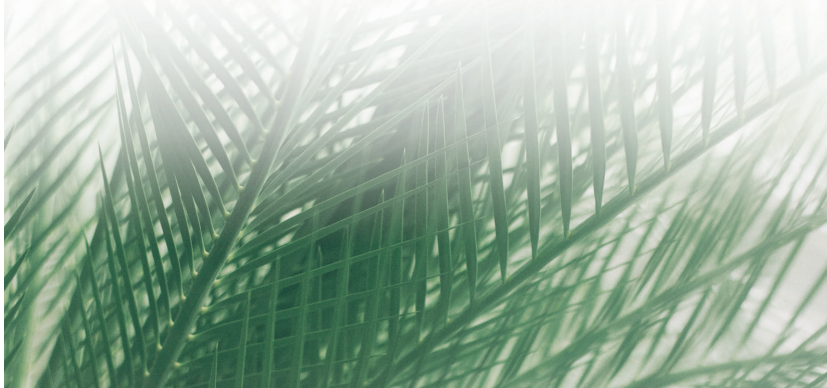

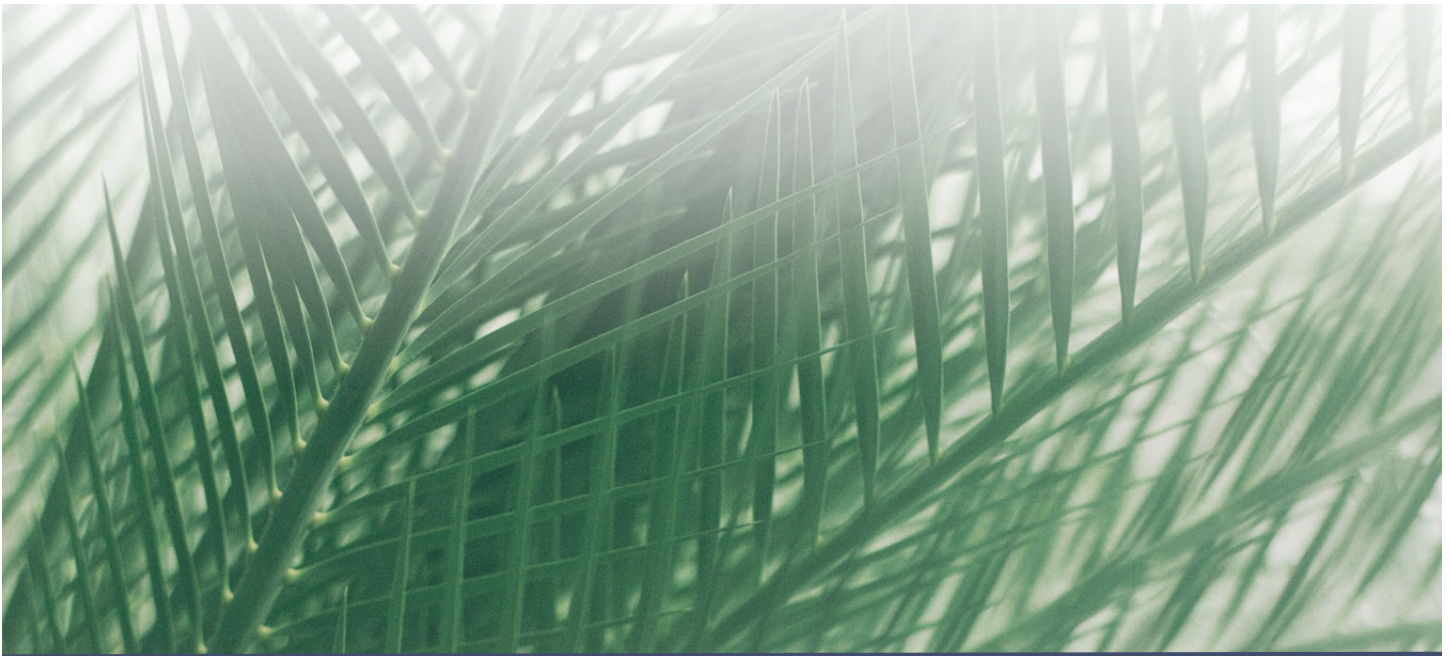

Trust the Story | In and Out of the Wilderness | **Enter**

Today is commonly known as Palm Sunday, but it's also Passion Sunday. It's called Passion Sunday because it's typically the day that we recognize Jesus' triumphal entrance into Jerusalem at the top of the Mount of Olives, processing through the city on a donkey. This procession leads us into his final week and days, which then will take us through the stages of the cross known in the Holy Land as the *via dolorosa*. Passion Sunday is the beginning of our Holy Week. It sets the narrative for the last final days to come.

Jesus also enters Jerusalem on behalf of the same promise given to the Israelites: to be a blessing to and for the world. This promise remains so that all would come to know that grace of God in the death and resurrection of Jesus.

This week we are called to enter deeper into what this Holy Week means for us, and how that draws us closer to trusting the story of God as we give witness to these tragic events of Jesus' life and death.

What does it mean for Jesus to enter Jerusalem that one last time, knowing what was to come?

What does it mean to share a meal with your friends one last time?

What does it mean to watch your friend Judas leave the room for good, without saying goodbye, only to bring your enemies to that familiar place, that garden where you talked and laughed, cried and hoped, learned and loved?

What does it mean to go on trial, to be mocked and flogged, to be crucified?

What does it mean to look into the eyes of your mother one last time?

What does it mean to ask, "Where are you, God?"

What does it mean to inhale your last breath?

This is what Passion Sunday asks of us, what the passion narratives asks us to enter into. This week should never be a week we have to simply endure, but rather a week when we allow our faith to wonder. How does this Holy Week impact our everyday living? How is God entering into the passion narrative, and also into our lives?
