Trust the Story | Shaped and Shattered | For All

MARGINS

Typically, when we think about what exists in the margins, we don't think of good things. We think of darkness, monsters, or people who are marginalized – as in pushed out of community. The margins are the extra space, maybe the wasted space, certainly the exiled space. We tend to think the good stuff is what we find in the center.

When we remember Jesus' interactions on this earth, we will notice that he tended to look towards the margins of society. He found the most exiled people and interacted with them (tax collectors, lepers, known sinners). He went places he was told were out of bounds (Samaria, the Decapolis, the home of a tax collector). He found some of his most passionate and dedicated followers in the margins including women like Mary Magdalene and the Samaritan woman at the well, tax collectors like Levi and Zacchaeus, and the demoniac of the Decapolis.

As we learn from healthy farming practices, a margin (hedgerow, uncultivated piece of land bordering a cultivated one) is a place of plant diversity, animal diversity, pollinator support, soil health, water management, carbon sequestration, and overall agricultural benefits. When God instructed the Israelites to leave margins around their fields, God was giving them and their community a gift. God said in Leviticus 23:22, "When you reap the harvest of your land, you shall not reap to the very edges of your field or gather the gleanings of your harvest; you shall leave them for the poor and for the alien: I am the Lord your God."

We honor God by honoring the margins and all that exists within them. Margins are places of creativity, diversity, and abundant gifts from God. Take a moment to creatively use the margins provided for you here. Doodle, take notes, play a game, brainstorm – allow the margin here to be God's gift to you. May it bring you joy, ideas, and peace.
