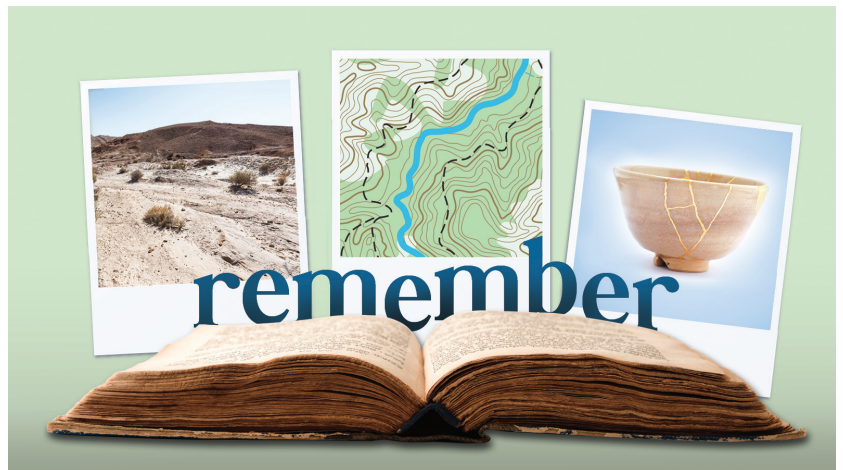

Trust the Story | Remember | Legacy

Then Moses went up from the plains of Moab to Mount Nebo, to the top of Pisgah, which is opposite Jericho, and the LORD showed him the whole land ... – Deuteronomy 34:1a

Moses was given the opportunity to stand with God on a mountaintop to survey the result of his 4+ decades of work and obedience to God. He saw the Promised Land stretched out as far as he could see. The Promised Land had been the goal since before Moses was even born. It was the goal before any of the Israelites had been born. God first promised the land to Abraham and his descendants before Abraham had any descendants at all.

Yet, here stood Moses, on the precipice of receiving this promise that had defined an entire nation of people. Finally. What do you think was going through his mind? Was he upset that he would not be allowed to enter into this land? Was he relieved that he had done the job God asked of him?

When you stand on the metaphorical mountaintop with God to survey your life, what do you see? Do you see that all of your steps have led towards a place of holy promise? Have some of our steps gone astray? Where in our lives has the Good Shepherd redirected us?
