The Peacemaker

*Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives.
Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid. – John 14:27*

Jesus promised to leave his followers his peace. Jesus' peace took him through chaos, danger, and all the way to the cross. As recipients of Jesus' peace, where will that peace take us? How are we being called to engage in this chaotic, dangerous, loud world as peacemakers? We cannot force our will or vision on the world because that in itself would be coercion and violence. Instead, we are called to proclaim the peace of Christ in the midst of the chaos. Maybe that means we physically put ourselves in places that need peaceful people. We might volunteer to be a loving, safe presence at community activities. We might spend our time nurturing children and helping them to grow into justice minded adults. We might volunteer to assist organizations doing the work of peace and justice. When we can't physically be a peaceful presence ourselves, we might financially support those who can. We might help pay for mission trips and charitable organizations who go into difficult situations to proclaim the peace of Christ. All of us at all times can offer our prayers for the peace of Christ to be made known in the world.
