What are your spiritual gifts?

Gifts of the Heart

FAITH: the ability hold on to the belief that God’s heart will prevail despite perceived barriers.

GIVING: the ability to share material wealth and resources freely – and with joy – to further God’s work in the world.

HELPING: the ability find spiritual value in the practical, behind-the-scenes tasks that sustain God’s work in the world.

HOSPITALITY: the ability to share God’s love by providing a warm welcome, food, shelter and fellowship.

MERCY: the ability to perceive the suffering of others, and to effectively minister comfort and empathy.

Gifts of Proclamation

DISCERNMENT: the ability to see God’s presence around us, even when it’s difficult to find.

EVANGELISM: the ability and desire to share faith in a way that fosters relationship and new possibilities.

KNOWLEDGE: the ability to understand and effectively use stories of hope and faith for God’s work in the world.

PROPHECY: the ability to proclaim God’s love and hope into current situations, sharing visions of a grace-filled future.

TEACHING: the ability to communicate God’s grace, love and hope in ways that lead to transformation.

WISDOM: the ability to understand and apply God’s grace, love and hope to complex, paradoxical or difficult situations.

Gifts of Action

ADMINISTRATION: the ability to organize information, events or materials to support God’s work in the world.

APOSTLESHIP: the ability to share grace and love across cultures, collaborating to create new ministries.

ENCOURAGEMENT/COUNSELING: the ability to listen well – comforting, encouraging and assisting people as they move toward wholeness.

LEADERSHIP: the ability to motivate, coordinate, and direct the groups of people gathered to do God’s work in the world.

PASTORING/SHEPHERDING: the ability to guide and care for others as they experience spiritual growth.
