## ONSITE SUMMER CAMPS

### VBS CREW LEADERS AND CO-LEADERS

June 15 – 18, 2026 | Commit to four days plus prep time | Background check for 18+

Spend a week exploring Bible stories with the kids! Crew co-leaders assist the crew leaders as they guide children through activities like crafts, snacks, games, science projects, music/arts, and more! Maintain a safe, engaged, fun and relational atmosphere. Minimum age for co-leaders: completed 6th grade. Minimum age for crew leaders: completed 9th grade or proven leadership and competency.

### VBS STATION HELPERS AND LEADERS

June 15 – 18, 2026 | Commit to four days plus prep time

Help kids dive deeper into classic Bible stories through fun activities. Station leaders present the provided VBS script multiple times during the morning station rotations. Station helpers assist station leaders with set up and clean up each day, and might be asked to help with advance prep work. Content for station leaders and helpers, as well as preparation time, varies depending on the chosen station. POP staff will assist as needed.

### WORSHIP ARTS CAMP CREW LEADERS AND CO-LEADERS

July 20 – 23, 2026 | Commit to four days plus prep time | Background check for 18+

Help kids make friends, build confidence, and discover their artistic gifts. Crew leaders supervise a group of 8 children, guiding them through various activities, that will culminate in performing a musical during the final afternoon. Co-leaders assist the crew leaders. Maintain a safe, engaged, fun and relational atmosphere. Minimum age for a co-leader: completed 6th grade. Minimum age for a crew leader: completed 9th grade or proven leadership experience and competency.

## CHILDCARE ASSISTANT

Sat/Sun/Wed | Other dates as needed | Background check for 18+

Provide care for our congregation's youngest children while their grown-ups are engaged in worship or other Prince of Peace activities. Help childcare staff as directed, engage in age appropriate play, monitor activity to ensure that children are playing safely and respectfully and help with snacks. We'd prefer a weekly or bi-weekly commitment for this role.

## POP KIDS – Kindergarten through Grade 5

Sunday mornings | Wednesday evenings | September – May | Background check for 18+

**SMALL GROUP LEADER:** Lead a grade-level-based small group in activities and discussion supporting the weekly Bible story. Curriculum guides, discussion prompts and materials are provided. Leaders supervise and support their group's participation as all grades gather in the chapel for large-group POP Kids worship, then lead roughly 20 minutes of provided activities for their small group. Volunteers can be bi-weekly.

**1:1 COMPANION:** Make sure ALL children can participate in POP Kids in ways that are comfortable and meaningful for them. Support a specific child's participation by providing opportunities for them to access sensory tools or take a sensory/movement break when needed. Volunteers can be bi-weekly.

**ROOM SUPERVISOR:** Monitor the chapel space during POP Kids to ensure safety, proper energy levels and appropriate behavior. Assist group leaders if they need to escort a child to the restroom. Intermittent volunteers are welcome!

**TECH BOOTH SUPERVISOR:** Help run worship tech and inspire kids to learn worship tech skills. Supervise 1-2 students (grades 4-12) in the tech booth. An intuitive sense for computer applications is beneficial, but POP staff will provide training for you so that you can train and assist the students. We use ProPresenter software for the screens, a computerized light

board, a computerized sound board, microphones and automated window shades.

## **PRAISE CHOIR – Kindergarten through Grade 5**

September – May | Background check for 18+

**PRAISE CHOIR CHAPERONE:** Assist with supervision when the choir participates in worship, and monitor children when they are not singing. Responsibilities vary based on the event or service. Commitment: Saturdays/Sundays when the Praise Choir sings and select events throughout the year.

## **STUDENT MINISTRY – Grades 6-12**

Wednesday evenings | September – May | Background check for 18+

**SMALL GROUP LEADER:** Help students build community and grow in faith. Lead a grade-based small group in activities and discussion supporting the weekly topic. Curriculum guides, discussion prompts and all materials are provided, yet you have the freedom to cater to the needs of your small groups. The night will start off in large group time. During this time, all students will gather in the chapel to sing with the StuMin band and set up the lesson for the day. This will run for approximately 30 minutes, after which students will join their small groups. For the next 45 minutes, you will lead your students in a deeper discussion of the topic using conversation, games and activities tailored to their needs. You will build a strong relationship with your small group by walking alongside them on their journey of faith.

**STUMIN EVENT LEADER:** StuMin offers a variety of engaging activities and events. We have lock-ins, camps, trips, movie nights, and many other activities, and we need your help! Volunteer to be a chaperone, a driver, an activity leader, and much more, depending on the event. Lead students in low-level physical activities like relays or mental games like trivia that encourage relationship building. Intermittent volunteers are welcome.

## **PIZZA HOSPITALITY**

Wednesday evenings | September – May

Provide food and hospitality for Wednesday night programming. Serve slices of pizza to students, families and leaders on-site for evening ministry programs. Refill lemonade dispenser if needed. Minimal clean up at the end of the evening includes wiping tables and running the dishwasher. Training is provided. Intermittent volunteers are welcome.

## **ADDITIONAL OPPORTUNITIES**

**HOSPITALITY:** Provide faithful hospitality to kids and families at Prince of Peace. Assist with food and beverage service during special events such as first communion, confirmation celebration, end of year parties, etc. Commitment varies.

**SEWING:** Use sewing skills to create props, costumes and keepsake items. Projects vary from easy stitching to advanced level. Examples include first communion stoles, items for VBS or other events.

**CRAFT PROJECT PLANNER FOR EVENTS (Great ADVENTure, EGGstravaganza, etc):** Plan meaningful crafts that bring Bible stories to life. Gather and prep materials for age-appropriate crafts connected to event themes. Input and suggestions for crafts are appreciated. Be on-site the day of the event if possible to direct additional volunteers hosting the craft stations.
