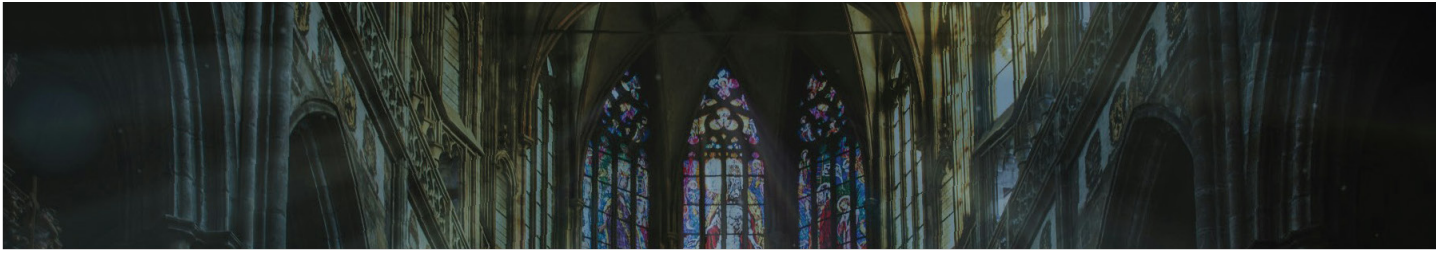

COVENANT

Near the beginning of this expansive story was Abraham and a covenant from God: Go out into the world and use what you have for mutual thriving, to be a blessing to other people, and your descendants will be more countless than the stars in the sky. This covenant changed Abraham's name, his purpose, his whole life as he set off from comfort into the unknown. This covenant was a deep commitment requiring integrity and a dedication to mutual thriving. This kind of relationship needs our time and attention.

Abraham's son Isaac, however, was fairly passive, even during his near-sacrifice that fateful day on the mountain. Life happened *to* him. Isaac's son Jacob, though – he fought for his covenant. He believed it, and wanted it so dearly that he stole it and ran, only to return many years later to show respect and make amends. Three men, three generations, three different reactions to the promises of God.

Years pass, and David makes a different kind of covenant with God. When David wants to build a permanent temple, God says no – promising instead to build within David's family a genealogy that would lead to Jesus. In God's covenant, the temple looks very different than what David had imagined.

*What do the promises of God look like today? Are they what you imagined?
Are God's promises just for you, or are they for everyone? How do you know?*

*Do you own God's promises, like Abraham – thinking, yes, these are for us, for me?
Are you passive in the face of God's promises? Or do you steal them, as though they'll run out?
Or, like David, do you allow God's promises to change the way you think, expand your imagination?*

Does our reaction to God's promises change the covenant?

ARTIST IN RESIDENCE



JUAN JOHN DE HOYOS

GUITARIST / ENTERTAINER | JUNE 7 | 4:00 pm

Juan John pulled his first guitar out of a dumpster in Phoenix, Arizona, when he was 13. On that discarded, broken instrument, Juan John taught himself to play Ozzy Osbourne's *Diary of a Madman* on the three remaining strings. He was opening for Clarence Gatemouth Brown and Robben Ford as part of the San Francisco blues scene by age 18.

Moving to L.A., Juan John composed music for Universal's *Spiderman 3*, HDNet's *Dan Rather Reports*, Animal Planet's *If I Ran the Zoo* and Agora Entertainment's *The Final*. Juan John honed his skills as a solo acoustic entertainer during extensive touring, garnering accolades wherever he performed. In 2007, he became the only artist ever to perform for the American Embassy in Kabul, Afghanistan while working with journalist Dan Rather. Juan John recently finished recording his new album, *The Hacienda*.
