



FORGIVENESS AND HOPE

Today we heard about a severe downfall in David’s legacy. He had been celebrated for his leadership, talent, and heart for God for a long time. In 2 Samuel 11, we now read about David growing comfortable in his power as king of Israel and how he abuses that power. How did his legacy as Israel’s greatest king survive his destructive flaws? As much as he loved God, David was not a perfect man. The more important thing was how much God loved David – even though David started the destruction of the kingdom of Israel in motion.

As we wrap up our series on Legacy, we now have the opportunity to consider the legacy we each will leave. What mark are we making on humanity and the planet spiritually, physically, socially, environmentally? How have we testified to the power of Jesus Christ to save, redeem, and restore in each of these areas?

An honest look at ourselves will reveal, just like with David, that we are complex people. Sometimes we shine brightly with the goodness of God, and other times we seem to be doing our best to snuff that light out.

Let’s take a moment to list some of our best qualities:

Now, let’s list some of those qualities which shame us:

Here’s the Good News: God’s ability to forgive far surpasses our ability to screw up. David prayed in Psalm 51:3-5, “For I know my transgressions, and my sin is ever before me. Against you, you alone, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight, so that you are justified in your sentence and blameless when you pass judgment. Indeed, I was born guilty, a sinner when my mother conceived me.”

Then he prayed verses 10-12 in hope, “Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me. Do not cast me away from your presence, and do not take your holy spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of your salvation, and sustain in me a willing spirit.”

As much as we are experts at selfishness and greed, our legacies are NOT our flaws. As we receive the forgiveness of Jesus in his blood, we receive clean hearts, fresh starts, and the opportunity to change our legacies. Ultimately the legacy we hope to leave has nothing to do with us, and everything to do with Jesus. May his mercy, generosity, and kindness be the legacy we leave.
