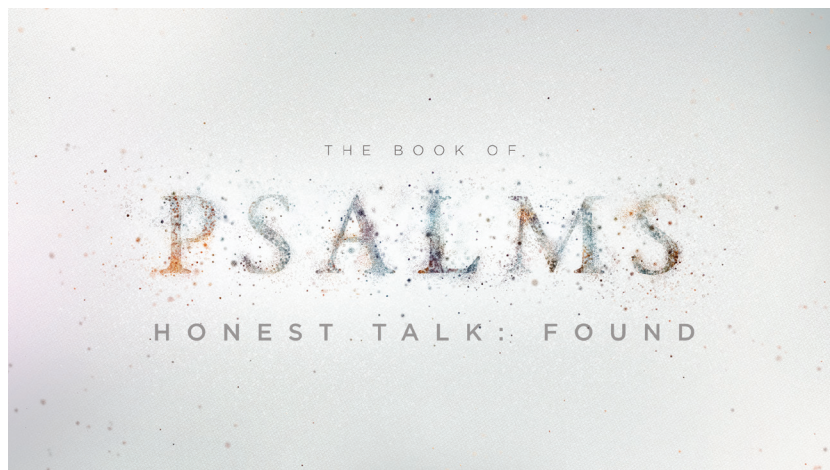

PSALM 23 AND THE CARE OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD

King David may have written this Psalm after he was anointed as King. Yet he recalls his earlier role as a shepherd as a meaningful metaphor for God's love and care. In David's culture, shepherds were not held in high regard. But David treasured this position as a meaningful reflection of God's tender and faithful care for his people.

What memories come to light when you hear this familiar Psalm? Have you heard it in a hospital room, care center or funeral? Is this psalm meant for the living, or has it only been regarded as a funeral text?

In a culture that runs fast with overbooked calendars and activities, how does it feel to read that the Good Shepherd makes you lay down in green pastures? What does that mean?

Sheep will not drink from the rushing water of a fast-flowing river. They are afraid of drowning with their heavy wrap of wool. So, what does the shepherd do? He leads the sheep to the still water, where they can drink without fear. Does this idea comfort you when you may be afraid? What does the "still water of God's grace" mean to you? Where do you find it?

"Your rod and staff, they comfort me." The shepherds used their crook to beat off the animals attempting to snatch the sheep away. The other end of this same crook could be used to reach sheep that had been fallen into a crevice, lifting them to safety. How does God's presence give you comfort in times of wandering, or when you feel trapped?

What does it mean to you that Jesus, the Good Shepherd, prepares a table before you in the presence of your enemies? Does this sound like good news?

"Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me (chase after me) all the days of my life." God's kindness and mercy does not passively follow after us; rather it runs after us every day of our lives. What does it mean that God comes hunting our hearts, not with judgment but with a love that tenderly carries us back home to safety, forever held in grace?

Our Father, who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy name,
